6. I **DON'T LIKE** (not/like) playing sports, but I **LOVE** (love) watching them on TV. Last night, I **WATCHED** (watch) a tennis match and my favourite player **WON** (win) a gold medal. I **FELT** (feel) so happy that I **CELEBRATED** (celebrate) it with my friends!

2. Write the correct form of the verb in brackets. Use either Present Simple or Past Simple.
